Special Report:

Michael Kinnison introduced Daniel Ronan, noting that Mr. Ronan has community organizing experience that will help HNA use the survey data for outreach.

The top three items on the survey needing attention were (1) traffic congestion, (2) safety and parks and/or natural areas, (3) appearance. In addition, subjective comments present a plethora of information that would need categorizing. Committee and guests agreed that the subjective information will be sorted first. Jack Radabaugh will serve as the coordinator with the intern, and they will confer in about two weeks after sorting is completed.

Jack Radabaugh (Sound Walls)

Footings for the Noise Walls are being installed on Interstate 5 north of Harlow Road. The wall needs to be continued south of Harlow Road for the benefit of residents who live along Garden Way. The Executive Committee will meet with Sonny Chickering, ODOT Manager, regarding the need for full construction of a wall south of Harlow Road, to link up with the noise wall along I-105.

Marian Spath: (Public Safety Committee)

National Night Out caravan will pay a visit; City councilors are scheduled to be on board.

Parks and Recreation promise fun and games for children, who may have the opportunity to look at and/or sit in a police car. Neighbors from both Cal Young and Harlow Neighborhoods can bring a picnic, games, lawn chairs, blankets, and drinks (no alcohol allowed). This is an opportunity to gather to meet each other at this event, itself action in the fight against crime.

Richard Edwards (Interim Chair):

A picture of the Historic Willakenzie Grange has been sent to Cindy Clarke for our official web page. The Grange was contacted regarding use for future HNA meetings, but has not responded.

Paul Cziko from the Center for Ecology and Evolutionary Biology asked to address a general meeting concerning responsible development. Committee discussed the issue but declined the request.

Marguerite Zolman (Street improvement & Traffic Calming):
